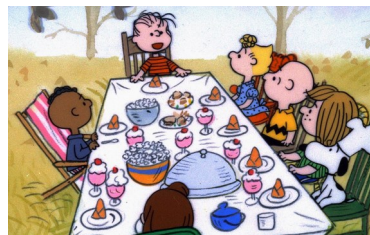

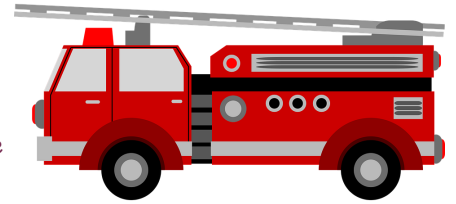
* There are four towns in the United States named “Turkey.” They can be found in Arizona, Texas, Louisiana, and North Carolina.

Make Sure To Plan Your Escape Routes And If A Fire Starts:

- ⇒ Remember to **GET OUT, STAY OUT** and **CALL 9-1-1** or your local emergency phone number.
- ⇒ Yell "Fire!" several times and go outside right away. If you live in a building with elevators, use the stairs. Leave all your things where they are and save yourself.



- ⇒ If closed doors or handles are warm or smoke blocks your primary escape route, use your second way out. Never open doors that are warm to the touch.
- ⇒ If you must escape through smoke, get low and go under the smoke to your exit. Close doors behind you.
- ⇒ If smoke, heat, or flames block your exit routes, stay in the room with doors closed. Place a wet towel under the door and call the fire department or 9-1-1. Open a window and wave a brightly colored cloth or flashlight to signal for help.
- ⇒ Once you are outside, go to your meeting place and then send one person to call the fire department. If you cannot get to your meeting place, follow your family emergency communication plan.

Fire Extinguishers

- ⇒ Get training from the fire department or a fire extinguisher manufacturer.
- ⇒ If you try to use a fire extinguisher on a fire and the fire does not immediately die down, drop the extinguisher and get out.
- ⇒ Before you use a fire extinguisher, be sure that the fire department has been called, everyone has left, and your back is to an exit.
